Why work experience?

Work Experience can give you the opportunity to:

- Sample a working environment
- Try out career options
- Build your self confidence
- Develop employability skills
- Support your course of study
- Support your UCAS application

Provides you with an insight into the world of work.

Gives you an opportunity to showcase and develop your skills and motivation as an individual.

Allows you to form an outline of the career path you may choose.

Enables you to build a foundation relationship with a local employer and make a lasting impression.

Research is the key to success

- Research using the internet or look for employers based nearby who might give you a placement.
- Emailing, telephoning and visiting employers in person.
- Research the company and find the name of the key person to ask for.
- Talk to friends, parents, family members and enquire if they can help out or support. Everyone knows someone!
- Active networking in person and online using social media sites like Twitter, Facebook and LinkedIn to follow companies.
- Register on volunteer, apprenticeship and job websites to search for companies and contact details.

Contacting the Employer/Placement

Contact the company by telephone to ask

"Do you take students on Work Experience Placements?"

If they are not sure, ask if its possible to speak to someone who can help. They may give you an e-mail of someone to contact.

Make sure you ask the name and details of the key person who is responsible for work placements.

A telephone number and e-mail will really help the next stage of the process. You will also need full address and postcode of the organisation

If they do not take placements move onto the next company on your list.





Getting Started

- Have all the details at hand especially dates of placement.
- Have a pen and paper
- Know the number/e-mail they can contact you
- Tell them who you are and why you are contacting them
- Mention the school you are attending



Organising Work Experience

- **Step 1**: Do your research & then contact employers to arrange a placement
- **Step 2**: Once you have found an employer that **has agreed** to take you on placement, ask for the **name and most importantly the e-mail address of the person** who will supervise you when you are on placement. You also need the **full address** and **postcode** of the organisation
- Inform them that they will receive an e-mail from Unifrog to complete with details of the placement
- **Step 3**: Complete the **Initial Student Form** in the Unifrog Placements Tool- **Deadline Friday 27**th **June**
- **Step 4**: The person whose details you put in the student initial form will complete the **Employer Initial Form** that will be e-mailed to them
- **Step 5**: Parents/carers will complete the **Parental Consent Form** that will be e-mailed to them from Unifrog

- **Step 6:** All forms will be e-mailed to the school for the Work Experience team to check over
- **Step 7**: Visits will be made **where necessary** to check any H&S or safeguarding concerns
- **Step 8**: Permission will be granted or denied (in very rare cases) by the school, for the placement to go ahead.
- **Step 9**: You, your parents/carers and the placement contact lead will receive confirmation via e-mail that the placement is going ahead.
- **Step 10:** Students to contact placement **before11th July** to personally confirm attendance.



IMPORTANT

- Students are representing St Bede's as well as themselves
- They are protecting placements for future students
- They must not share anything on social media about their employer or placement.
- They must seek permission to take photographs for their Journal/records
- They must not disrespect their employer or any of their clients
- They must follow your employer's instructions/Health and Safety Guidance
- If students are removed from a placement, parents/carers will be informed and contacted by the Head of Year



The Company cannot take my child on the dates of work experience but at another time.

If the placement is in school time, it may be able to go ahead in consultation with the HOY. We do not want it to clash with other events in school.

The student <u>will still need a placement</u> within the allocated week.

Employers may be able to move it to a school holiday. If they can then it does not need to go on our system. It is an arrangement between the employer and the parent/carer

We have a family holiday booked during the placement dates.

You will need to contact school and complete a leave of absence request

The placement company can only take my child for some of the days during the set week

The student can have another placement on the other days to make-up the week or they will need to be in school on the days not on placement

We are not sure where to start do you have any recommendations?

Students will be sent lists of previous placements. There is no guarantee that a placement is available again this year, but it's worthwhile contacting.

How Many hours do they have to work during the week?
