## Fact File

- **54** countries make up the Commonwealth in Africa, Asia, the Americas, Europe and the Pacific
- **2.5 billion** citizens live in Commonwealth countries. This is **around 30%** of the world's population!
- The people of the Commonwealth are a **diverse group**. Some live on very small islands like Nauru in the Pacific, and some live in big countries like India in Asia
- The Commonwealth Games are also called the **'Friendly Games'** because they use sports to bring people across the globe together. They are held **every four years**

## The Queen's Platinum Jubilee and the Commonwealth

Queen Elizabeth II was once the recognised Head of State for all the Commonwealth countries. Now, she is Head of State in **15 countries across the world**, with many choosing to become republic.

## The Commonwealth and service: during and after the World Wars

The Commonwealth played an incredibly important role in both World Wars. **Over 3 million soldiers and workers from across the Empire and the Commonwealth** served alongside the British Army in WWI. We must honour their service and sacrifice.

After WWII, Britain invited people from the Commonwealth to come to the UK and work to **rebuild the country**. They were given citizenship and the same rights. Lots of these people came from the Caribbean and are known as the **Windrush Generation**.
